This season the team moved up to the U15's and were put in an 8 team division 3 competition. With the addition of Hasan, Emil, Malik, and Trevor at the commencement of the season, this meant that we were very competitive from the outset despite not picking up our first win until the 3rd round of the season versus Plumpton Grey at Harry Denison.

Unfortunately, the team lost Trevor to focus on senior cricket after round 7 but were able to rebound during the second half of the season, with Kayden joining the team and eventually finishing just 3 points short of a first finals appearance.

Again, it was our batting that let us down, particularly losing 7/20 against Kellyville White on Remembrance Day including 3/0 after being 4/62 chasing just 134 for victory at a very fast Harry Denison and being bowled out for just 72 against Plumpton Grey at Harry Denison in what was just their 3rd win of the season.

Nonetheless, it was pleasing to see the belief build within the team as the season progressed with an expectation that we would win even against Blacktown City and Pedan despite not quite being able to put in our best 60 over performance against either side.

Thank you to Christopher for again lending players throughout the season when we were short when the U13's weren't certain to make the finals:

Aariz: Two games with a first ball wicket that made their opening batter look in disbelief Mike Gatting style

Arshpreet: One game with a very tidy spell and a key wicket

Aidan: One game controlling the end of the run chase.

Ryan: One game looking very comfortable at number 3 and cleaning up the last two wickets.

**Emil** - One half of the new opening partnership with Joel, Emil put his all into every aspect of the game (though that may not have always been a good thing when he was bowling). He was very comfortable off the back foot, but recognising when to get on the front foot will allow him to stay in for longer.

**Trevor** - Trevor filled our spin bowling void and got a wicket almost every spell. He also proved that he can bat long and score when he gives himself the chance.

**Justin** - Justin continued being a key part of the fielding effort, making sure that the ball stayed new. He had a habit of making the easiest catches look the most difficult but almost always took them in the end, especially when it was off Xavier's bowling. **Joel** - Joel was promoted to opening batter this season and had a prolific time, being able to balance offence and defence which resulted in consistent runs every game. He was very active in the field as well, contributing with a catch or runout almost every game.

**Johan** - Johan at times had a rough go of things while adjusting to the longer pitch but still had a knack of taking multiple wickets when needed. He once again was one of the players that brought energy to the field and was always there to congratulate the other players on their successes.

**Malik** - Malik's slow left arm swing bowling bamboozled quite a few batters as he worked them over with variations in flight and length. While not resulting in the most wickets, he did have the best economy and close to the best average in the team.

**Haad** - After a 73 run partnership with Hasan in the first game opening the batting, Haad was moved to three where he continued plugging away and taking on the short ball. He was oftentimes the recipient of one of the better balls bowled against us on the day which limited his run tally. Once he learns to consistently counter those deliveries, he'll be in for a big season.

**Waleed** - If ever there was a man that should develop an ego and assert his place in the bowling order it would be Waleed. He regularly squared up batters, swung it both ways, and stepped up when needed, especially against Schofields both times we played. When he doesn't have the pressure of having to actively score, Waleed was able to bat long and contribute well to the total, exemplified by top scoring with 14 from 14 overs.

**Danica** - Danica stepped up to take a more active role as the on-field captain this season. She voluntarily took a bit of a backseat in the batting and bowling orders and shared wicket keeping responsibilities with Khodi. She was nonetheless still effective in her role during the bowling innings, taking 7 wickets at 15 and 10 catches.

**Khodi** - Khodi improved on his hitting from last year and continued being great in the field. He top scored with 46 at Peter Van Hasselt, only missing out on his maiden 50 by somehow missing a juicy full toss.

**Xavier** - Xavier's role veered away from all-rounder and toward specialist opening bowler this season and was rewarded with the most wickets in the team. He would, at times, try too hard and lose his shape but was otherwise very consistent with the ball and in the field, becoming a bit of a caughtbowled specialist in the process.

**Kayden** - We didn't get to see the best of Kayden due to only playing four games at the end of the season. He still showed his potential with bat and ball with big hitting and tight bowling.

**Hasan** - Hasan is an attacking allrounder who hit the stumps consistently and aimed to dominate opposition bowling line-ups. His highlight from the season was his 88 not out from 63 balls at number 6 vs Kellyville in what only ended up being a 24 over innings.
